Thank you for your continued support of Chattahoochee Valley Community College (CVCC). We couldn't do all that we do without you, and 2022 has been no exception. It is my pleasure to present this year's Annual Report, which provides an overview of the highlights and events of the past year.

As we reflect on the past year, I am proud of all we have accomplished together as we continue navigating the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. Our ultimate goal is to provide students with a high-quality education and opportunities to develop skills that will ensure they succeed in their chosen career paths. Our faculty and staff have worked tirelessly to deliver a supportive learning environment that allows our students to thrive. We are genuinely grateful for their passion and dedication to this mission.

Our proudest achievement in the past year has been our institutional growth. Fall semester of 2022, the College achieved a 20 percent increase in enrollment over the fall semester of 2021. Our dedicated Student Services team has worked hard to reach out to prospective students and to create a welcoming and inclusive environment for all. Secondly, the College has worked on student retention efforts through our federally funded Strategies to Enhance New

Student Engagement (SENSE) program. Thirdly, the College has enhanced the campus by implementing renovation projects on two buildings acquired from Troy University, Pitts Hall, soon to become the new Workforce Training Center, and the Bookstore, which will house a new student center. Lastly, three new program offerings have been approved and are slated to be launched in the summer of 2023, Medical Laboratory Technician, Paramedic, and Pharmacy Technology.

The ability to effectively serve this community is more critical now than ever as it empowers individuals with the knowledge and skills essential for success in all aspects of life, including personal and professional growth, civic engagement, and social mobility. HEALTH SCIENCES DIVISION HOSTS TRADITIONAL PINNING CEREMONY

Congratulations to Chattahoochee Valley Community College's Health Sciences Division! Sixty-three nursing, medical assisting, practical nursing, phlebotomy, and nursing assisting graduates were pinned in a traditional pinning ceremony held in May. The ceremony signifies that students have joined the sisterhood and brotherhood of nursing and other health professions and

are ready to serve in the healthcare industry. The history of the pinning ceremony dates back to the 1860s, when Queen Victoria awarded Florence Nightingale the Red Cross of St. George to recognize her service as a military nurse during the Crimean War. In honor of tradition, students lit candles and recited their respective pledges.

CVCC AND MILES COLLEGE FORM PARTNERSHIP FOR STUDENT SUCCESS



In November, CVCC partnered with Miles College, located in Fairfield, Alabama, to create scholarship opportunities and a pathway to earning a bachelor's degree. There are four components to the agreement which include: a collaborative and seamless transfer process, scholarship eligibility, reverse transfer credit, and student services.

CVCC students will be considered for admission

to Miles College after earning an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science with up to a maximum of 64 semester hours transferring.

The new partnership will provide reciprocal privileges for use of Miles College's Resource Center, College and Career Center, and admission to athletic events. There are also opportunities for advising from both Colleges.



CVCC Nursing Graduates' Pass Rates Exceed National and State Averages

CVCC nursing graduates continue their trend of excellence with pass rates exceeding national and state averages on the 2022 National Council Licensure Examinations (NCLEX). The CVCC Stand-Alone Practical Nursing NCLEX-PN pass rate was 100%; the 1+1 Practical Nursing pass rate was 90.91% for an average pass rate of 95.45% for PN, and the Associate Degree Nursing RN pass rate was 94.12%.

The national pass rates were 79.68% for PN and 74.13% for ADN. Alabama averages were 94.81% for PN and 88.66% for ADN. Congratulations CVCC Nurses!

CVCC Celebrates 2022 Graduates in Spring Ceremony



The 2022 Commencement Ceremony was held on May 6 at the Columbus Convention and Trade Center with 242 students graduating. Jimaal Crump and Mary Elizabeth Wagnon served as Student Marshalls in recognition of their outstanding achievements while enrolled at CVCC. Wagnon also received the prestigious President's Award, and Brody Perdue was awarded the Christopher Clarke Patterson Award for excelling in community and college services and scholarship.

CVCC AND TROY UNIVERSITY PARTNERSHIP FOCUSES ON TEACHER EDUCATION

In June of 2022, CVCC and Troy State University signed an articulation agreement so students can now work toward a bachelor's degree from Troy University's campus or online while earning an associate degree from CVCC.

This partnership was developed to create a concurrent enrollment agreement allowing students to complete up to 18 credit hours at Troy while still enrolled at CVCC. Eligible students must intend to pursue a four-year degree in elementary education or collaborative education.

"We are extremely excited about this opportunity for our students to transfer seamlessly to Troy University," said CVCC President Jackie Screws. "In addition, with a focus on students interested in the field of education, we are proud to be a part of building a strong educator pool for our communities at a time when there is a shortage of people entering the field."

comprehensive support services for veteran students and their dependents including but not limited to personal, academic, and career counseling, tutoring and academic assistance; help with obtaining student financial aid; and other activities designed to ease the transition to campus life for these students. The Center will also coordinate academic advising and admissions counseling with military bases and national guard units in the area.


Matthew Holtzendorff has been appointed the CEVSS Coordinator, bringing a wealth of knowledge and military experience to the program. "I knew this position would be an incredible opportunity to serve and assist a part of our community that has given up so much of their personal lives in service of our country," he said.



CVCC STUDENT ANTONIO DAVIS EXCELS IN WELDING PROGRAM

“Life hardships bring about growth.”

That’s the motto of Antonio Davis, a sophomore studying welding at Chattahoochee Valley Community College.

“I was homeless,” Antonio quietly shared as he reflected on hard times. “Me and my mom were struggling to find a place to stay. God placed me right here in this welding program. I didn’t have any money, so it was very important for me to be able to get the scholarship.”

Despite adversities that would cause most to dispel their dream of success, Davis is on an academic scholarship at CVCC and has maintained a 4.0 GPA. In addition, through the welding program, he’s been able to take advantage of an apprenticeship opportunity where he “earns while he learns.”

“Now, I’m in an internship at Atchley Steel company,” he said with excitement in his eyes. “It’s a game changer for me and my mom. I’m helping her out and getting a

lot of experience in welding. I’m basically able to take the knowledge that I got from CVCC and apply it.”

Davis understands that welding is a high-demand occupation and looks forward to one day owning his own welding company. When asked what keeps him motivated, he referenced his faith.

“What really motivates me to stay positive in life and go through all the trials and tribulations is God. He gave me peace that passes all understanding. He gave me the courage to continue to keep pushing. At the end of the day, we’re all going to go through a lot in life. It’s all in how you handle it.”

Davis has handled adversity with hard work, determination, and a humble heart. He hopes that sharing his story with others will make a difference.

“For me, having this testimony, will inspire others and hopefully let them know that whatever you’re going through, God is able. He’s able to do abundantly and exceedingly in your life if you just trust Him and have faith. And, that’s exactly what I have learned to do.”

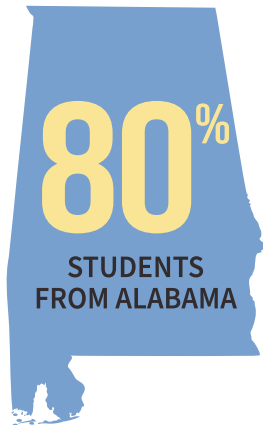

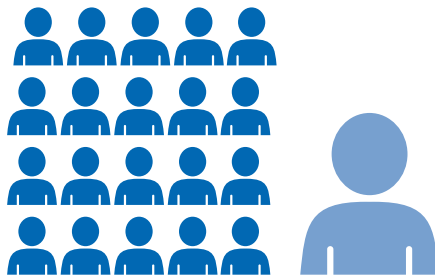

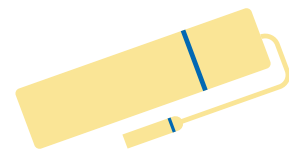
