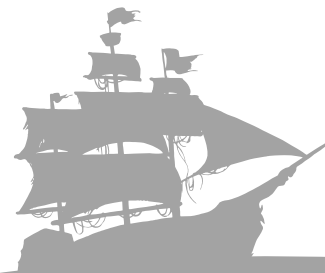

### Notes about the Literature/History sequence and Transferring

Students must complete a 6-hour sequence in either history or literature:

**Eng 251/252 – American Literature I & II or Eng 261/262 – British Literature I & II**

**His 101/102 – Western Civilization I & II or His 201/202 – United States History I & II**
